MATH 100	Calculus I	FSE	1	5/6/2024	6/15/2024	40-90	\$1,146.40	This is a single position that will cover both MATH 100 labs and marking for other math courses offered during the May term. The TA will work with the course instructor of MATH 100. Duties may include weekly meetings, lab/tutorial instruction, marking, and weekly hours as a drop-in MACE tutor. Ideally the applicant will have a strong knowledge of Calculus I, experience in mathematical proof, and feel comfortable tutoring a variety of lower division math courses. Experience in marking and tutoring is helpful. The TA should be comfortable working independently and as part of a team. Please note that labs and MACE hours will start the week of May 1 so the TA will need to be available for a meeting on that day with the instructor. If the successful applicant has not already gotten approved training they will also need to be available in the beginning of that week for training. Applications must include a resume showing relevant work, training, and other experience. NREM 333	Field Applications in Natural Resource Management	FE	1	8/19/2024	9/6/2024	130	\$3,725.80	This field-based course provides students with a practical understanding of principles of integrated resource management. The course focuses on the many values on a landbase through modularized lessons and an authentic case study approach. Meeting with various stakeholders and professionals working in the field allows students to explore relevant and contemporary issues in natural resource management. This is a summer field course which will run from Aug. 19 through 30th (TA will be with the class daily), however the position will run from Aug. 19 – Sept. 6 to assist with marking after the course ends. The exact starting date will be confirmed through discussions between the course instructor and successful applicants. Applicants should have taken this or an analogous course in the past, or had employment experience in forestry, land use planning, or wildlife habitat management. The TA will assist in the planning and delivering of the course, provide logistical support and assist with marking assignments such as field notebooks. Applicants are required to have current valid first aid certification and a valid class 4 driver's license. In addition, the TA will be required to be involved in arranging for and picking up supplies in advance of the course, care and maintenance of UNBC field gear and running errands as needed. Duties for a total of 90 hours for the semester will include such things as grading online discussion forums, grading short assignments and essays. For this grading, the TA will give moderate amount of feedback to the students. Generally, a portion of the grading is done by the instructor as well so that the TA and instructor work as a team. Grading expectations will be discussed with and guided by the instructor. There will be TA meetings with the instructor as required. Other duties will include a limited amount of instruction delivery as guided by the instructor. There will also be limited outside of class support provided by the TA. BIOL 123	Introductory Biology I	FE	1	5/15/2024	6/7/2024	50	\$1,372.00	<p>This laboratory-based course is an introduction to the biological sciences including the nature of life, cell structure and physiology, function, development, metabolism, genetics and evolutionary theory. For the Spring 2024 semester, we require 1 experienced TA with a background and strong knowledge in cell and molecular biology and genetics that will be comfortable teaching biological concepts. This Spring session course is run as a short term, intensive course and so the TA will need to be available MWF from 8 am to 1 pm for the duration of the course (May 13 - June 7). Duties will include pre- / post-lab prep and cleanup, assisting the SLI with the labs and marking with a short turn-around (generally daily). The TA will also be responsible for assisting with setting up, administering and marking the final practical exam (June 7). Due to the intensive nature of this course, preference will be given to applicants with experience with Biology 123 at UNBC, have a strong background in cell and molecular biology and genetics and have already completed the TA training (through the CTLI) and Lab Safety Training (through Chemstores). 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BIOL 301	Systematic Botany	FE	1	8/12/2024	8/31/2024	120	\$3,439.20	This course introduces students to plant taxonomy and biodiversity, including principles of systematic botany, nomenclature and classification. Special attention is given to the identification of the native regional flora. This course is taught in an intensive field camp format from August 12th to 31st, 2024 (including the weekend). Instruction consists of a mix of laboratory-based plant identification exercises (in the Coast Mountain Science labs in Terrace) and visits to representative ecosystems in the Terrace and Prince Rupert area. The TA for this course should have good plant identification skills and be able to assist students in the use of technical floras such as The Flora of the Pacific Northwest or the Flora of BC. Knowledge of the terminology associated with identifying plant structure is important. Past students from BIOL 301 (Systematic Botany) are encouraged to apply. First aid skills valuable. ORTM 333	Field School	FE	1	04/19/204	5/10/2024	145	\$4,061.12	This an intensive block ORTM field school involving leadership and supervision in both front country and wilderness / backcountry travel settings; expertise in wilderness safety/first aid, canoe tripping and paddling are essential. The teaching assistant will help with driving throughout the field school. Academically, understandings of national parks and protected areas, as well as socio-ecological theory and environmental history fit and support the course content and assessment. The full course (17 teaching days) is off-campus and includes 10 days in Jasper National Park. Field dates are from April 22 - May 9th, 2024. The TA is responsible to supply their own food and personal equipment. Duties will involve leadership roles on the river while canoeing, instruction of backcountry living and travel, tutoring students and assisting marking of topical research papers and presentations in the field, helping arrange field school logistics, site visits, and guest speakers.
