eLearning Developer Continuing Studies Term, Full-time August 2024 – March 2025

Purpose

Reporting to the Educational Technology Manager, Continuing Studies, the eLearning Developer assumes responsibility for development of engaging online learning content in a variety of subject areas and delivery modes. The eLearning Developer plays a key role in course development projects and works closely with the Continuing Studies Coordinators, subject matter experts and other team members assigned.

Responsibilities

The eLearning Developer needs to have the ability to adhere to sound instructional design principles, utilize various learning mediums to develop courses from raw content, immerse in multiple projects with shifting priorities and timelines, write clear instructional materials, provide coaching and training, attend to details, and evaluate and make recommendations regarding instructional design in various modalities. The eLearning Developer is required to complete course development projects to UNBC quality standards within agreed upon timelines, budgets, and client specifications.

Duties include but are not limited to:

- Guiding development of course outlines, learning activities and assessment, etc.;
- Designing storyboard, user flows, and learning flows based on raw course materials to effectively communicate interaction and design ideas;
- Applying instructional design best practices and methodologies to design, develop, and continuously improve immersive online courses from ideation to evaluation;
- Developing digital learning products that are engaging and creative while maintaining the instructional integrity and validity of the solutions;
- Creating and working with design templates and continuously improving UI design to meet technical specifications and the evolving e-learning design tendency;
- Troubleshooting technical design issues within SCORMs and other learning applications;
- Collaborating with stakeholders, contractors, clients, and team members in planning, developing and maintaining online learning courses;
- Conducting design analysis and analyzing expectations of target audiences;
- Assessing, revising, and providing constructive feedback on the work of subject matter experts;

- Creating test cases and conducting usability tests and quality assurance;















Qualifications

The successful candidate will possess the following:

- A Master's degree in distributed learning or e-learning, educational technology or computer science; and
- Minimum 3 years' demonstrated experience incorporating appropriate educational technologies into online course design and development based on best practices.

An equivalent combination of education and experience will be considered.

The successful candidate will be able to effectively demonstrate the following:

- Proficient with web design technologies such as JavaScript, HTML/HTML5, CSS, XML, etc;
- Advanced knowledge and experience of authoring and creative tools such as Articulate, Dreamweaver, Photoshop, etc.;
- Experience with SCORM within an LMS;
- Experience with video production/post-production and graphic design;
- Strong knowledge of web accessibility principles and practices, and implications for course design and development; and
- LMS administrative would be considered an asset.

Salary

This position has been classified at a Grade 11. The annual salary range for this position is \$77,768.60 to \$80,990.00 and the normal starting salary will be \$77,768.60 pro-rated based on length of term.
