Resume and Cover Letter Best Practices

Your resume and cover letter are your ticket to landing an interview. At the Career Centre, we recognize the crucial role these documents play in your job search journey. Here are essential tips and common pitfalls to avoid as you craft your resume and cover letter.

- **Tailoring is Key:** Each job application should have a customized resume and cover letter. Review the job description carefully and tailor your documents to highlight the skills and experiences that align with the role.
- **Be Concise and Relevant:** Your resume should be no longer than two pages. Focus on relevance by listing your experiences and skills that are most applicable to the job.
- **Quantify Achievements:** Whenever possible, quantify your achievements with numbers, percentages, or specific milestones.
- Format Effectively: Use a clean, professional layout with consistent formatting. Make sure your resume is easy to read by using bullet points, adequate spacing, and a standard font.
- **Proofread:** Typos and grammatical errors can make a negative impression on potential employers. Proofread your documents multiple times, and consider having someone else review them to catch any mistakes you might have overlooked.
- Write a Strong Opening for Your Cover Letter: Your cover letter should grab the reader's attention right from the opening paragraph. Be clear about the position you are applying for and why you are a strong candidate. Make it personal and engaging to encourage the reader to look at your resume.
