- 3. **Prepare Your Pitch**: Practice a brief introduction (often called an elevator pitch) that explains who you are, what you're studying, and what kind of roles you're looking for. Keep it short and confident.
- 4. **Dress Professionally:** First impressions count, so aim for business casual or formal attire to show employers you're serious.
- 5. Check Out the Career Prep Tools: UNBC's Career Centre offers excellent resources to help you prepare for the fair. From resume tips to interview guidance, take advantage of these tools to boost your confidence. <u>Explore the Prep</u> Tools.
