Job Posting: Graduate Teaching Assistant (TA) Training Co-Facilitator

Position Overview:

The Center for Teaching and Learning Technology (CTLT) invites applications for the position of TA Training Co-Facilitator. This role serves as a foundational step for a graduate student aiming to transition into the Lead Facilitator role for our TA Training Workshops. This part-time opportunity provides an immersive experience in facilitating educational workshops and mentorship under the guidance of the current Lead Facilitator, who acts as a mentor rather than a supervisor.

Key Responsibilities:

- Assist in the facilitation of three 4-hour TA training sessions that focus on developing essential skills such as conflict resolution, situational roleplay on sensitive topics, and problem-solving. These sessions are typically hybrid (synchronous, in-person and online). There are typically ~3 training sessions held per semester. Contracts include hours for preparation of materials, facilitation, and corresponding with participants (~24 hour/semester).
- Collaborate with the Lead Facilitator and CTLT staff to prepare and organize training materials and sessions.
- Contribute to the integration of feedback from previous workshops to refine and enhance the training program.
- Support the tracking of workshop attendance and actively engage participants to ensure a productive learning environment.
- Receive mentorship from the Lead Facilitator to gain insights and skills necessary for assuming future leadership roles within the training framework.
- Work with various academic units and organizations to ensure the training content remains relevant and effective.

Qualifications:

- Currently enrolled as a graduate student, preferably <1 year into your graduate studies.
- Experience in teaching, TA roles, or similar educational settings is preferred.
- Keen interest in developing teaching and facilitation skills.
- Demonstrated ability to work effectively in a team environment.
- Strong organizational and communication skills.

Compensation:

The position offers a wage of \$22 per hour, with a total contract of approximately 20 hours, including some preparation and the facilitation of the sessions in an assisting role to the lead.
