



Transfer Agreement between

University of Northern British Columbia

And

School District 73 (Kamloops/Thompson)

OBJECTIVES

- TO PROVIDE OPPORTUNITIES FOR SECONDARY SCHOOL YOUTH TO ENHANCE THEIR EDUCATION IN THE NATURAL RESOURCE DISCIPLINE.
- TO SUPPORT TRANSITION FROM SECONDARY SCHOOL TO POST SECONDARY.
- TO ESTABLISH A PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN BRITISH COLUMBIA AND SCHOOL DISTRICT NO.73

Agreement

In that the UNBC Natural Resources Management Curriculum Committees have reviewed the academic and applied content of the SD 73 Natural Resource and Environmental Studies Program, the following is agreed to:

Students who successfully complete the program and meet University entrance requirements will receive:

- Transfer Credit for the BSc. Natural Resources Management:
 - o NREM 100-3 Field Skills.
 - o NREM 101-3 Introduction to Natural Resources Management and Conservation
- Pre-Approved admission to UNBC for the BSc. Natural Resources Management for any of the following majors:
 - o Forest Ecology and Management
 - o Wildlife and Fisheries
 - o Outdoor Recreation Management and Conservation
- Applications for residence from first year students for the Fall semester that are received on, or before, March 1st are guaranteed an offer of a room. Space is therefore guaranteed for transferees to UNBC from the SD 73 program.
- In the year preceding admission, rooms will be available, in the UNBC residences, for students and parents at no charge. This is available between May 15 and August 15, for a period of three days. Space must be reserved in advance.
 - o Students will have the opportunity to be partnered with current UNBC students for a day.
- UNBC Office of University Advancement and the Chair of Ecosystem Science and Management will work together with local industry in Kamloops to develop opportunities for entrance scholarships for transferring students.
