Partly using a storytelling and visual methodology, and extending this sentiment into “all our relationships,” we argue in this presentation that friendships and deep relationship to place (geography) need to be understood as fundamental to building and advancing a critical, politicized, anti-colonial, anti-oppressive health humanities in Canada and beyond. The paper explores the decade long development and expansion of the Health Arts Research Centre (HARC) in northern British Columbia, including its recent launch of an open-access website (HEAL Healthcare) devoted entirely to arts-based anti-oppression healthcare learning tools that any clinician, activist, professional, or lay-person might be able to use in efforts to combat oppressive internal biases affecting their practice or worldview.
