STEP 1. APPLY

Each of your referees will receive an email from UNBC which will include an online link to complete and submit your reference form to UNBC. Please note that relatives are NOT considered references.

Upload Statement of Interest (maximum two double-spaced pages)

Please describe the reasons behind your desire to enter the nursing profession and the Northern Baccalaureate Nursing Program (NBNP). Mention any special skills or talents you have that will enrich your future work as a nurse (e.g.: travel, volunteer, experiences, etc). It is important that your writing be specific rather than general. Additionally, you should check your writing for spelling, typographical, and grammatical errors. Please ensure your name is at the top of each page of your document.

If you have ever withdrawn from, interrupted, or been **required to withdraw** from a nursing program, please include the name of the institution, date of withdrawal, and provide the details on a separate sheet of paper at the end of your Statement of Intent.

STEP 2. Complete the CASPer Assessment

□ All applicants must complete the Computer-based Assessment for Sampling Personal Characteristics (CASPer) (Canadian Nursing) as part of the admission process. Your test score results will be forwarded to UNBC from CASPer.

CASPer is an online assessment tool that captures applicant's non-cognitive skills and interpersonal characteristics. Information and online registration are available on the CASPer website. Applicants who do not complete the CASPer assessment will not be considered for admission. CASPer results are valid for one year. Applicants who completed the assessment in previous years must retake it for the current application cycle.

The CASPer assessment tool is comprised of 12 sections of video and written scenarios. Following each scenario, you will be required to answer a set of probing questions under a time contract. You can review sample CASPer scenarios and view the test structure at https://takecasper.com/.

POST ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

• Successful applicants to the Bachelor of Science in Nursing program will be required to complete a Criminal Record Check (CRC), Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPRC or BLS certification), proof of immunization, N95 mask fitting test and LearningHub SPECO courses.
