This process will include reviewing and commenting on the Environmental Impact Statement Guidelines, reviewing and commenting on the Environmental Impact Statement Summary, and reviewing and commenting on the Comprehensive Study Report. Community meetings will be held in the community of Likely in the town hall once the process is underway. The meetings will give us a chance to collectively discuss our comments and concerns regarding environmental impacts of the proposed process. No meetings have been set to date.



Cariboo recovery needs your voice

Recently the federal government released the much anticipated draft caribou recovery strategy required under the Species At Risk Act. The Canadian Parks and Wilderness Society (CPWS) has reviewed the recovery strategy and released a "report card" that identifies where major improvements are needed. Environment Canada received top grades for its investment in scientific research on Critical Habitat Identification and for the proper identification of caribou threats, but other areas were not so positive. CPWS has listed six major areas requiring improvement, including: policy direction; failure to set the goal of caribou recovery for all populations; and failure to properly identify woodland caribou's critical habitat.

With the public consultation period extended to late February 2012, there is time for your voice to be heard. Sign the petition at caribouandyou.ca. Join the 28,000 other people who support protecting Canada's woodland caribou-rich home. If you're already part of the herd at Caribou and You, please take a few minutes to send a personalized letter to Environment Minister Peter Kent, House of Commons, Ottawa ON, K1A 0A6. Remember- no postage necessary!
