- e.1) **Scott** Working alone strategy is still under works. Working alone groups are, the regional hospital staff, the Shift Engineers at UHNBC, the security guards at UHNBC, the travelling student/staff members going in-between communities and anyone working after hours. Are there any other groups that haven't been mentioned?
 - Student recruitment officers They are travelling alone and on campus alone. There are a lot of vacancies now. There is one in Vancouver that works alone all the time and is based out of her home. Approximately 10 recruiters.
 - What about the ones that work from home? Should that be included in the working alone or is that a different policy? They should be checking in and out every day

when working from home. Working on getting a proper system. (approx. 15-40 workers)

F. Incident Report Summaries

- f.1) Review of the Worksafe and other classified incident reports for First Aid Incidents. Safety Investigations: & Other Reports sent to members for review. – Scott
 - Four first aid incidents:
 - Unloading a cabinet, tore a fingernail
 - Pinched finger loading a bike onto a bus
 - Metal splinter in pinkie
 - Cut to forehead, bumped head.
 - Four time loss incidents:
 - Right thumb locking it is most likely an ergonomic issue, but this person works from home and quite far away, so it is harder to investigate.
 - Heavy box fell on someone's hip while moving laundry machines.
 - Back strain while moving a heavy desk
 - A worker was climbing a ladder and blacked out for a minute and fell off. A more complex investigation is being done and looking at ladder safety.
 - A TV was mounted to a wall incorrectly, it wasn't mounted to a stud, and it fell off.
