UNBC's mission is to Ignite, Inspire, and Lead change.

Ensuring safety in our university setting is crucial for staff, students, and faculty. Here are some key aspects of our Campus Safety that are continuously in motion:

Emergency Preparedness: Our Safety Team has prepared Emergency Operations Centre binders and vests, to be deployed in the event of EOC activation. Our Security Team has refreshed site First Aid kits and checked all four Automated External Defibrillators. Main Campus fire drills are scheduled for the last two weeks of September. Our Communications Team has updated communication protocols for emergencies and will deliver the information to leadership on August 8.

Campus Security: Our Security Team plays a crucial role in maintaining a safe and secure environment for our students, facility and staff by conducting continuous surveillances, and detecting suspicious activity. The Security Team also responds to injuries and provides First Aid. Here at UNBC we encourage staff, students and members of the public to be vigilant and report any suspicious activities promptly to UNBC Security 250-960-7058, from a UNBC landline # 3333 or by using the SAFE APP.

Safe Facilities and Infrastructure: The Facilities Team conducts and coordinates regular maintenance of our campus buildings, walkways, and parking lots, and have recently re-painted the lots. Shift Engineers maintain the Bio Energy plant, which provides heat for indoor air and water. Facilities also maintains exit signs, sprinklers, emergency eyewashes, showers, autoclaves and so much more!

Laboratory Safety: UNBC's main campus has many research labs. We promote and monitor proper handling, storage and disposal of chemicals and biological materials. Contact your instructor or the Dispensing Chemist at ChemStores for information about orientations and training.

Employee Health and Wellness Programs: Employee Wellbeing strives to facilitate safe and equitable participation in the workplace for UNBC employees by providing support to employees with workplace accommodations, medical leaves, return-to-work planning, and the Employee Family Assistance Program.

Student Resources: Students at UNBC have access to a wide variety of resources, including the Academic Success Centre for tutoring, workshops and research skill development, the Access Resource Centre for accommodation arrangements, the Career Centre for help with resumes, job opportunities and interviewing skills, the Medical Clinic, and counseling services.

Cybersecurity: Our IT team protects our systems, network and protects the community from digital attacks. They accomplish this by enforcing software patching policies, ensuring software is secure and up to date, and working to create a culture of security awareness.

A note from Scott: Before purchasing electrical products, always check for certification marks, such as CSA, cUL, or cETL. Electrical products that plug into an electrical outlet must meet Canadian national safety standards and be certified by an accredited certification body.

Build Grab-and-go Bags: As wildfires can require quick evacuation, prepare


grab-and-go bags for each family member.
